American Recovery Act to Help Counties

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed into law the \$362 billion Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, established under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP). This was the third in a series of bills passed by the Federal Government to address the issues caused by the Coronavirus Pandemic.

The bill set aside \$65.1 billion in direct federal aid to America's counties. Shelby County is expected to receive approximately \$9.4 million in two separate allocations. A Treasury portal was set up for counties to register and request their Recovery Funds with Shelby County Auditor, Amy Berning, handling that process. The first allocation of \$4 million has been received. and the Commissioners and other elected officials are reviewing the Treasury Guidance to determine how to use the funds. Commissioner Ehemann commented, "While earlier grant funds had to be used guickly, the American Rescue Plan monies have a longer timeframe in which they can be spent allowing the County to develop a plan that looks at long-term impacts."

Funds must be incurred and obligated by December 31, 2024, with all projects completed by December 31, 2026.

The Commissioners have hired a Grants Administrator to help facilitate the process. Priorities include expansion of Broadband, a new fairgrounds restroom, storm -water and sewer improvements, small business grants, grants to the hospitality industry, and expansion of child care programs.
