

Ft. Loramie Industrial Park Expands



The Ft. Loramie Industrial Park expansion allows for several new sites, road and utility expansion.

Expansion of the Ft. Loramie Industrial Park is going out to bid in July with completion of the project expected by May of 2026. This project will unlock an additional 60 acres of land, creating new lots from 3.8 to 6.7 acre in size, with one site up to 40-acres. The expansion includes the extension of water, sewer and road infrastructure along Industrial Drive and Production Drive.

"This expansion of the Industrial Park will enable us to better support existing businesses and attract new industry to our village", said Mayor Randy Ahlers. "We also continue to market the 24,000 s.f. spec building at 1000 Tower Drive that is available for sale or lease", added Ahlers. "With an available building and shovel-ready sites, the village can offer several options for a growing business."

The expansion is further bolstered by the wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) upgrade completed last spring and was facilitated by a \$724,000 grant from the State of Ohio's One-Time Strategic Grant Program.

Michigan Metal Coatings Opens in Sidney

After choosing Sidney to locate their new metal coatings operation in 2023, Michigan Metal Coatings, MMC, has completed the equipment installation and is now operating at 930 Vandemark Rd.

"The new coating line has started up successfully and we celebrated the first successful manufacturing run with customer products on June 26th," said Yoshi Sato, Sidney Plant Manager. "Since then, we have gradually begun receiving additional products from customers and are now ramping up toward full-scale mass production," added Sato.

MMC committed to invest \$20 million in new equipment and create 60 new full-time positions, with a total annual payroll of \$3.57 million. MMC anticipates hiring additional personnel as the ramp up materializes.

Michigan Metal Coatings is a leader in the application of chromium free, corrosion-resistant coating systems for Tier 1 automotive customers. Headquarted in Huron Michigan, MMC now operates three facilities in the U.S. MC Systems, its parent company, is located in Nagoya, Japan.

Sidney-Shelby County Ranked #12 Micropolitan Area

By Site Selection Magazine in 2024 - the 14th Consecutive Ranking in the Top 100!

In March, Sidney again was ranked as a top Micropolitan by Site Selection Magazine. "This is the 14th consecutive year that Sidney-Shelby County ranked in the Top 100," said Jim Hill, SSEP Executive Director. "Ohio led the way among states with the most Top Micros with 20 communities ranking, including Sidney at #12," added Hill.

Site Selection's micropolitan rankings are based on the number of qualifying new or expanded investment projects each year. Sidney has ranked in the Top 100 for 14 consecutive years, with 2022 being the highest ranking at #3.

The Office of Management and Budget defines a micropolitan statistical area as a core urban area with a population between 10,000 and 49,999 along with adjacent counties within the commuter pattern.

"Sidney also ranks well in the Policom Economic Strength Rankings at #133 in 2024, making us the 3rd highest Ohio micropolitan in the Policom rankings," said Hill. "Policom utilizes a broader formula to rate the long-term economic strength of a micropolitan area. Since 2015, Sidney has consistently ranked as one of Ohio's top micropolitan areas in the Policom rankings."

"Shelby County is indeed a manufacturing powerhouse and the statistics back that up." Said Hill. "

- Highest manufacturing employment per capita in the State of Ohio, with 45.5% of the county employment in the manufacturing sector.
- Economic output in manufacturing totals more than \$9.1 billion annually.
- 4 of the top 6 manufacturing employers in the Dayton Region are located in Shelby County
- The Sidney zip code was recently ranked as the third hottest housing market in the Dayton region.

Choice One to Expand in Sidney

A vacant commercial office building in Sidney is getting a new lease on life, thanks to a local civil engineering firm based in the city. Choice One Engineering will revitalize a vacant property located in Sidney's west warehouse district at 2633 Campbell Road. The 26,000-square-foot office facility's renovation will include the demolition and remodel of 15,000 squarefeet of office space, break areas and restrooms, along with other

major building updates.

The acquisition of this new facility, which has been largely vacant for five years, will enable the company to move its employees from its current headquarters, immediately add 12 new jobs and continue to expand its workforce with nine full-time employee positions within three years.

"Choice One Engineering is excited to continue our growth in the City of Sidney, where we were founded 31 years ago," said Choice One Engineering President Matt Hoying. "Having this opportunity means we get to stay close to the communities and people who have supported us over the years and allows us to continue to invest in those communities."

The firm held an informal "wall breaking" at the end of June, where the team took sledgehammers to a wall in the building to kick off renovations alongside Level MB Construction. Choice One

At a Sidney City Council meeting held in June 2025, the city approved a 15-year, 75% tax abatement for Choice One Engineering for its purchase of the building. The abatement is estimated to be \$348,000.

"As the City's long-standing engineering partner, Choice One Engineering has been an integral part of our community's progress and success," said the City of Sidney's City Manager Andrew Bowsher. "Their continued investment in Sidney is not only a testament to their growth but also a powerful signal of confidence in our city's future. We are thrilled to see this next chapter unfold and are confident that their commitment will bring lasting benefits to both their business and the greater Sidney community."
